Term begins for Year 7 students on Friday 07 September 2018 – the Green Drive entrance will open at 08.00 and students are expected to arrive ready for a prompt start at 08.20. Students must be in full Academy uniform and carrying the Academy rucksack with the necessary resources ready to begin work. Students will take part in a range of lessons and activities on that day and will depart the Academy at 13:40 again via Green Drive.

Team Building Activity Day W/C 15 OCTOBER 2018

As part of their induction week we have arranged an all-expenses paid Team Building day to Longridge Activity Centre, Marlow on W/C 15 October 2018.

Students and Langley Academy staff will be taken by coach to the adventure centre where they will have the opportunity to take part in a range of land and water based activities. These include field games, climbing wall, laser tag, giant swing and dragon boating.

We will always ensure that students who may feel a little anxious about some of the activities are encouraged to take part or at least to be a part of the team supporting others - we do hope everyone will be prepared to come on this trip. They will be required to arrive at the Academy at the usual time on the day and will return to the Academy at approximately 16:00 traffic permitting! They must be wearing academy PE kit on the day – tracksuit bottoms, t shirt, pullover jacket and trainers. Additional clothing requirements carried in a separate bag are detailed below

CLOTHING

Swimming costume/spare underclothing.

Warm tops e.g. sweatshirts, track-suit tops, fleeces. Generally lots of thin layers are better than one thick layer. This is especially important on days when the weather is not particularly warm.

T-shirts or thermal top to wear under the warm top.

Track suit trousers or lightweight trousers, NOT JEANS as they are restrictive and, when wet make you lose heat very quickly.

Waterproof jacket and trousers (to block the wind chill effect) are very important, not just for activities, but also to wear generally in inclement weather. They don't have to be expensive, basic quality ones are fine.

FOOTWEAR

Wet suit boots, wet shoes or soft soled shoes e.g. gym/deck shoes MUST be worn at all times in boats. Thick soled/heeled boots or wellington boots are not suitable. It is important that the shoes will stay on your feet even in the water, so you should avoid anything loose fitting which could slip off. These items are bound to get wet, so an old pair of trainers will do and don't forget you will need some dry shoes to wear on your journey home. NO FLIP FLOPS PLEASE.

HEAD GEAR

For warmth and protection: fleece/peak/sun hat as appropriate.

OTHER ITEMS

Towel

Waterproof sun protection cream of the strength that you normally use.

Plastic bin liners to put wet gear in for the journey home.

Additional items to bring with them on the day -

Any necessary medication (to be given to staff on the day of the trip before getting on the coach) Please note students with existing medical conditions who do not have their prescribed medication e.g. asthma inhaler, epipen etc with them will be unable to attend on the day.

- Packed lunch (free school meal students will be provided with a packed lunch from the academy restaurant on the day)
- Small change for the vending machines on site at the centre.

Students must not bring any valuables.

This trip is provided free of charge to all students and will be a great opportunity for students and staff to work together, learn about new experiences and most importantly to have fun!

In order to take part in the raft building and in particular to test its efficiency on water parents must confirm that their son / daughter can swim 10 metres
