Digging in for potato project

PUPILS saw the fruits of their labour when they revealed the results of a 'grow your own potato' competition.

Youngsters at Parlaumt Park Primary School, in Kennett Road, harvested the heaviest crop to win the Potato Challenge, held at Langley Academy, in Langley Road, on Tuesday.

Pupils from four Slough schools took part in the competition, run by Newbury & District Agricultural Society. Catherine Ensby, Parlaunt Park Primary School teacher, said: "The children have learnt so much during this project and, just as importantly, they've really enjoyed themselves,"

with gardening kits.

The children planted potatoes in compost bags in March, and made their own potato salads with the produce.
